SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The **Gordon and Marion Smith Foundation Vancouver Young Artist Scholarship** is available to a graduating student, enrolled in a public or private Vancouver school, who has demonstrated excellence in the Visual Arts and is planning to continue his/her education in the Visual Arts. (*visual arts include traditional media as well as photographic and digital media*)

Evaluation Criteria:

Scholarship applications and supporting material will be evaluated on:

- artistic ability, achievements and personal objectives in the arts
- caliber of the work in comparison to other students at the same level of study in the same discipline
- the quality of the presentation for this application
- incomplete submissions will not be considered
